The prophet replied:

<sup>8</sup> No, O people, the Lord has told you what is good, and this is what He requires of you: to do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God.

"What is good." So many people today express ideas of what is "good." But God has told us what is good, and it often looks nothing like what we've imagined.

What is "good" for us, is also (as it happens) what God "requires" of us. Yes, God wants what is good for us. What's more, He exerts His sovereign wisdom and power to *"work all things to-gether for our good."* (Romans 8:28)

"This is what He requires of you." It's music to my ears, and water to my soul! We CAN know what He wants, because He has told us.
